
DON QUIXOTE

Conference Saturday, March 3, 2012 University of Portland

This conference will emphasize a multidisciplinary study of Don Quixote in order to bring fresh synergy around interpretations of the novel. Through conversations between scholars of history, literature, political science, film, fine arts, theology, and psychology we hope to invigorate Don Quixote as a man of our times. We especially invite papers to explore the novel in a comparative context, its political and social relevance, its utopian possibilities, and its commentaries for other disciplines. Each participant will receive a \$600 stipend to defray the costs of travel and accommodation. We expect that the multidisciplinary focus will generate new perspectives and lead to an edited volume publication.

Abstracts should not be longer than 500 words and should address the unique contribution of your paper, your discipline or scholarly method, and your contact information including email.
